

Rams Put on Show at First Playoff Game

For their first game of the playoffs, the 2010 Central Dauphin Rams stepped onto the turf at Landis as a team in the classic green jersey and white pants combo.

In a post-game interview, senior Seidu Issah said the Rams wanted to make this game "a memorable one," and they definitely accomplished that with a score of 42 points against Warwick's 7 points.

CD started off with their defense stopping the Warrior's first series. When the offense came on the field, Issah brought the Rams into Warrior territory to set up a Brandon LaVia to Adam Hollinger touchdown. Don't let the kickers go unnoticed: Evan Brandes made all of his extra points and Jordan Bair had some great kicks soar into the end zone.

The Rams' defense, which includes Andrew Zwally, Artie Rowell, Zach Wilk, Jeremy Seaman, and Scott Benkovic, came out strong and ready with a quick wrapup by #55 allowing no

Warrior gain. CD's defense went on to stop Warwick's second attempt to put some points on the scoreboard.

An impressive 4th down pass by QB Brandon LaVia and catch by Jon Schnaars snagged a Rams first-and-goal setting up a second CD touchdown and extra point to put the Rams ahead 14-0.

After a Warwick fumble, CD recovered the ball and turned that series into another 7 points.

An interception by Zach Wierman near the 50-yard line set up another touchdown series for the Rams, to put CD up 28-0.

A third down stop by Scott Benkovic and Kemji Rajis finished off the first half.

In the third quarter, a 30-yard pass from Brandon LaVia to Brian Morris brought the Rams to the Warrior's 15-yard line. Up next—another touchdown by Adam Hollinger.

Then, a great punt return by Adam Obaya brought the Rams to the Warrior's 17-yard line.

As the Rams' starting lines retreated to the bench, #17 Bobby Shaffer took the field to complete a touchdown pass to junior Sam Adams.

Finally, Trei Gilcrist sacked Warwick's QB with help from Mike Appleman. The Warriors snuck in a touchdown minutes before the final whistle, ending the game Central Dauphin 42, Warwick 7.

The Rams presented themselves as a TEAM on Friday night. Though the linebackerturned-fullback Adam Hollinger played an outstanding game, with 142 vards and three touchdowns, many Rams had their time to shine. Issah, the ever-present sophomore power had 94 yards and a touchdown, too, QB LaVia made some great plays and throws to Jon Schnaars. Zach Wierman grabbed yet another interception. And junior Bobby Shaffer proved himself under the lights.

Adam Hollinger demonstrated the Rams' sense of teamwork perfectly as he quoted, "I can't thank the lineman enough" when asked about his three touchdowns on Friday night.

CD Rams' First Annual Mini-Camp

Under a darkening white summer sky, the 2010-2011 Central Dauphin Football team took the turf. Some wore black shorts, some blue. Some were equipped with yellow tackle arms. Some allowed a shoulder pad to protrude out of place--but all donned an off-white practice jersey and a ram-horned helmet.

During these nights of the first-ever Rams Mini-Camp on June 14-18, Landis Field was split in half: the Junior Varsity team near the panthers' goal post and the Varsity team near the Rams'. The JV players were very quiet on the left side of the field: marking their positions and learning important tips from the coaching staff. On the right side of the turn, the Varsity team was very verbal as they encouraged and critiqued each other at each sound of the whistle.

However, the teams are not set in stone quiet yet. A significant benefit of Mini-Camp is that "it helps the coaches to evaluate the players," Coach McNamee added.

Aside from assessment, Coach McNamee sees the first Central Dauphin Mini-Camp as "a great head start" to the upcoming season. This year, the coaching staff eagerly approached the season by adding the Mini-Camp to isolate improving playing time instead of squeezing in practicing after morning workouts.

It allowed the team to run drills and even 11 vs. 11 games—just like on Friday nights—as if it was a fall practice. The only catch: no contact. At the end of the last night of Mini-Camp, a long whistle demands all players to clap it up and congregate at center field to perform Ram jacks. After starting off out of sync, the Rams gathered themselves and tried again, as any newly formed team would.
